Victims and Human Trafficking - Assignment (template)

What is human trafficking?

Identify the components of human trafficking and describe the differences between trafficking, smuggling and labour exploitation. Explain the impact that age and consent have.

What are the indicators of a victim of human trafficking victim?

Who are most vulnerable to human trafficking? Under what circumstances?

Describe some of the signs to look for when a person is victim to human trafficking.

Which policies or objectives address human trafficking?

Is your Pacific Island country a signatory to the Palermo protocol? Describe its purpose.

Read the articles of the protocol and briefly describe the responsibilities that each country is obligated to address.

What legislation or policies do you have in place? Describe those responsibilities and actions to address human trafficking.

What support services can you identify/offer victims?

Think about your current set-up (building access, courtroom processes, access to information, publications, data collection, internal support opportunities and external support agencies.

Create a list of the services that a victim may need. Identify corresponding responses to those needs.

Identify as many community support or non-government agencies in your area. What services do they supply?

Identify the actions you can take/suggest?

Read the NZ draft action plan and the USA 2020 Trafficking in Persons report.

For your Pacific Island country, what recommendations can you contribute to? Consider education, data and statistics collection, internal support and co-operation, public information.
