Victims and Human Trafficking – Video Interview of a Victim Advisor

Introduction:

Governmental and non-governmental agencies globally have begun taking steps to combat human trafficking. There are multiple approaches to end human trafficking, ranging from education and investigation to prosecution and victim support services.

Watch a recorded video interview with Court victim advisor Beverley Duncan-Hurley, a service manager with Court Services for Victims team from the NZ Ministry of Justice, Wellington.

Beverley shares her story and experiences as a victim adviser telling us about the NZ legislation for victims, inter agency collaboration efforts and the resulting code of victims' rights. She also talks about the skills required to deal with any victim of crime and the role and skills required to be a victim advisor and deal with victims of any crime.
